Another organization, the YWCA Hanover is dedicated to eliminating racism, empowering woman and promoting peace. The YWCA offers a range of free counseling and other services including Safe Home, 24/7 services to support victims and survivors of domestic violence. *“Domestic violence is a serious matter in our area and impacts men, woman and children”*, said Jody Shaffer, Executive Director, the YWCA Hanover. *“This helps us to further raise awareness and supports our curriculum of supportive and preventive services as we strive to end the family cycle of domestic violence”*.
